Dear Toledo Chapter members,

Happy New Year! I hope that your holiday celebrations were joyous, both professionally and domestically. For church musicians it is a balancing act to fulfill professional responsibilities with quality time for family and friends.

In 18th century Pennsylvania several German organ builders

were quite active supplying churches with pipe organs and their work was described as "that ingenious business." Even among the technological marvels we enjoy today the pipe organ remains one of our most fascinating achievements. In a recent interview with British organist and TikTok personality Ana Lapwood (The Diapason, January 2025) she was noted for her ease with addressing people both in person and on camera. Asked for words of wisdom she replied, "the thing I just always keep in my head is that you never know what tiny interaction could sow a seed in someone's head that makes them want to try the organ themselves, makes them want to go to an organ concert, or it just makes them think differently about the instrument or about classical music in general. I see all of our roles as organists as evangelists for the instrument . . ."

Something to think about in the New Year - how do we as organists, who play this "ingenious" instrument, engage people and share our enthusiam for the organ and its music? Invite them to an organ concert? Invite a young person to attend a PPP program? Demonstrate the organ to interested church members? We should all be aware of opportunities for that "tiny interaction" that could develop a greater appreciation for the organ!

I hope to see many of you on Monday, January 13!


