## From the Dean



Dear Friends,

It's the coldest week of the winter (so far, that is!), and I am moving very fast! Not only do I need to keep warm, but this is also the week prior to my annual Faculty Artist recital for Heidelberg University. I normally play this program in the balmy days of early October; this year circumstances forced a change. Thank goodness the Schantz or-

gan in my church holds its tuning well, even in extremes of weather!

Speaking of organs that stand the test of time, I wonder how many of you have played the Dutch "cabinet" organ that stands in Gallery 24 of the Toledo Museum of Art? You may not even know of its existence, but let me enlighten you. It is a unique and interesting instrument!

This small organ has only one manual (4 ½ octaves) and no pedals. It was built ca. 1785 by Dutch builder Johannes Strumphler. Completely contained in a wooden cabinet, not unlike a piece of dining room furniture, the organ would have stood in a (presumably wealthy) home. The air supply is generated by a foot pedal, which might have been operated by a servant back in the 18th century. The person who operates the foot pedal must stand on one leg and pump with the other. The organist must also stand, as there is no bench and no "knee-room" for sitting.

When the doors are closed, it is not at all obvious that this piece of "furniture" is a musical instrument. It looks like a place to store china, crystal, and table linens! But, with the doors open, one can see pipes above the keyboard. The lower "cabinet" actually contains the wind chest and whatever bellows mechanism moves the air into it.



I was privileged to play this instrument on December 28. The museum hosted a number of events during the week between Christmas and New Year's, under the heading of "The Great Art Escape." Gladys Rudolph, a member of our chapter and a docent at the museum, invited me to give a 30-minute program. She also played a recital, as did Barbara Craig of our chapter.

For my program, I knew I had to limit myself to music for manuals, and I decided to play only pieces that could have been played in 1785. I developed the idea of a virtual "tour" of Europe in the 16th-18th centuries, selecting pieces by Louis-Claude D'Aquin (Noel nr. 10), Antonio Cabezon (Variations on a folk song), Girolamo Frescobaldi (pieces from the Messa della Madonna), John Stanley (trumpet tune in D), Jan P. Sweelinck (variations on "Mein junges Leben"), F. W. Zachau and J.G. Walther (chorale preludes).

Bob Rudolph, husband to Gladys, was kind enough to be my foot-pedal bellows-pumper. He knows how to keep just the right amount of air in the chest and when to add more. Gladys assures me there will be other opportunities to play little programs on this instrument. If there is interest out there among our membership, I think she would be very glad to hear from you!

Stay warm, everyone, and happy practicing!
