# ORGAN RECITAL—Michael Gartz

Michael Gartz, chapter member and Adjunct Assistant Professor of Organ at BGSU, will present a faculty recital on the organ at St. Aloysius Church in Bowling Green on Sunday, February 10th at 4:00 p.m. His program will consist of music by William Mathias, J.S. Bach, Margaret Weber, Charles Tournemire and others.

Michael is the organist at St. Timothy Episcopal Church, and he is the organist for the Diocesan Choir at Rosary Cathedral in Toledo and the Canterbury Singers USA. He has played in a number of English cathedrals including London's Westminster Abbey and St. Paul's. He owns and operates Liberty Music, a mail-order firm specializing in rare classical 78-rpm records. He also has a personal collection of 35,000 discs.

St. Aloysius Parish is marking the 20th anniversary of the installation and dedication of their Letourneau pipe organ. The organ consists of 27 stops and 32 ranks of pipes. The concert is free and open to the public. The church is located one block south of Wooster St. between Enterprise and Summit Streets.
