I would encourage you to take advantage of every opportunity to become more involved in the chapter. When programs offer an opportunity to play, take a chance and put yourself out there. Or if you play frequently at your church and never get to hear someone else, come out to the programs and be inspired. I know I always want to leave our programs and get to the organ for some practice time as soon as I can.

Coming up this month, we will have our Annual Student Recital on Sunday, March 17 at 3:00 p.m. The recital will be at Hope Lutheran Church, Toledo. Come and be inspired by the next generation of organists. I'm sure the students would appreciative and be inspired by the encouragement of a good audience. In April, we will be joining with the Ann Arbor chapter for an organ crawl in the Toledo area. They will finalize plans just after you receive this, so we will

send out information within a couple of weeks.

Finally, the time is again approaching to elect new members to our Executive Committee.
