The recital is sponsored by the Toledo Chapter of the AGO (American Guild of Organists) and the Monroe Street UMC's Concert Series. Matt, the winner of the 2017 Great Lakes Regional AGO/Quimby RCYO (Regional Competitions for Young Artists), is a student at Oberlin College and has been accepted into the conservatory's accelerated Master of Music in Historical Performance degree program. His impressive program will feature works by Bach, Mendelssohn, Gigout, Florence Beatrice Price, Rheinberger, and will conclude with Dupré's Symphonie-Passion. A freewill offering will be collected.

Matt Bickett

Matt Bickett, from Portsmouth, Ohio, is a fourth-year student at Oberlin College and



Conservatory, where he pursues a Bachelor of Arts in Religion and a Bachelor of Music in Organ Performance. While still a candidate for both degrees, he was accepted into Oberlin Conservatory's accelerated Master of Music in Historical Performance degree program. His work focuses on musicologically-informed approaches to historical styles of organ and harpsichord playing. He currently studies organ with Jonathan Moyer, harpsichord with Mark Edwards, composition with Elizabeth Ogonek, and conducting with Gregory Ristow, and has coached with Marie-Louise Langlais, George Ritchie, and Bruce Neswick.

Alongside his work at Oberlin College and Conservatory, Matt serves as Assistant Organist and Choirmaster at Christ Episcopal Church, Oberlin, where he plays for liturgies and assists in directing the semi-professional choir. In 2017, Matt established the Oberlin Cantata Project, a period orchestra and choir specializing in 17th- and 18th-century concerted vocal music. Recent performances have taken the ensemble to Cleveland venues where Matt led the group in performances of sacred cantatas by D. Buxtehude and J. S. Bach. As organist, he has performed at notable venues such as St. Mark's Episcopal Cathedral in Seattle, Washington; Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Portland, Oregon; St. Columba Cathedral in Youngstown, Ohio; and in Cleveland, Ohio at Church of the Covenant and Trinity Lutheran Church. Recently, Matt was awarded the Presser Fellowship from the Presser Foundation and took first prize in the Great Lakes Regional AGO Quimby Organ Competition.

The concert will feature both Chiaroscuro Men's Chorus and Carillon Women's Choir combining to present "Frostiana: Seven Country Songs" composed by Randall Thompson (1899-1984) using the poetry of Robert Frost (1874-1963). The work was commissioned in 1958 for the celebration of the two-hundredth anniversary of the Incorporation of the Town of Amherst, Massachusetts. The work premiered on October 18, 1959 sung by the Bicentennial Chorus, bringing together all elements of the community. Thompson used the idea of men's and women's choirs coming together in a single performance as the basis for his composition. The combination of Robert Frost's heartfelt poetry and Thompson's beautiful melodies are so effective that this beautiful, thoughtful and witty music has become one of America's most loved Choral works.

About the Choirs and their Directors

The mission of the *Chiaroscuro* Community Men's Chorus is to sing meaningful men's choral music that engages minds and touches hearts of the listeners. The men in the chorus are professional and amateur musicians from a diversity of professions, representing a wide range of ages. We have the distinction of being the only community men's chorus in Lenawee County, Michigan.

Carillon Women's Chorale was founded in 2001 the group focuses on music composed for women and often by women composers. Carillon members come from all walks of life and all professions to include some professional singers/music teachers. For their expressive singing and mature tone, Carillon was one of seven Michigan choirs selected by blind audition to perform in the 2015 American Choral Directors Michigan State Conference.

The concert is free and open to the public.


