


The program includes **Rejoice in the Lamb** by Benjamin Britten, a festival <u>cantata</u> for four soloists, <u>SATB</u> <u>choir</u>, and <u>organ</u>. Composed by <u>Benjamin Britten</u> in 1943, the text is from the poem <u>Jubilate Agno</u> by <u>Christopher Smart</u> (1722-1771). The poem, written while Smart was in an insane asylum, is a highly idiosyncratic and ecstatic praise and worship of God by all created beings and things, each in its own way. The concert will also include works by John Rutter, Alice Parker, René Clausen, David Isele, and others.

Take elevator up to Langley Hall.






