Bios of the Candidates

Mark Mathias has served as Director of Music Ministry at Toledo's Christ Presbyterian Church since 2011, where he directs the choirs (Adult, Children's and Handbell) and is the organist. He has served in similar positions in other churches of various denominations (in Ohio, Iowa, Kentucky and West Virginia) and is a former music educator.

Mark holds a Bachelor's degree in Music Education from Malone College (Canton, OH) and a Master's degree in Church Music from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary (Louisville, KY); he has also earned the AGO's Service Playing Certificate. Mark is the sub-dean of our AGO chapter and previously served as the sub-dean of the Canton, Ohio, chapter.

He "dabbles" a bit in arranging for choir and handbells, and he is the chimes director for the Young Voices of Toledo.

Dennis Johns is Organist and Director of Music and Liturgy at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Maumee. He began there in 2014, having served in a similar capacity at St. Paul's Lutheran (Maumee), where he led the process of purchasing an organ. Prior to his work as a church musician, he had a 14-year stint as Choir Director for Toledo Christian Schools. He joined the AGO in 2011 and has enjoyed meeting colleagues and participating in the varied programs. He has particularly enjoyed opportunities to see, hear and play on a wide variety of instruments.

Melissa Flowers is the Associate Director of Liturgy and Music at St. Michael the Archangel Catholic Church in Findlay. Her primary duties at the church, in addition to playing the organ, are leading the Children's Choir, Handbell Choir and small vocal ensembles. She has been involved in the Toledo AGO for eight years.

Pam Davis is the Music Director and Organist/Pianist at Community of Christ Lutheran Church in Whitehouse, where she directs vocal and handbell choirs. She has been a Toledo AGO member since the mid-1980's, when Sr. Mary Ellen Nagle called to invite her to join. Since then she has served many terms on the Executive Board and as scholarship chairperson. One of her favorite memories is of Jacob Taylor experiencing his first "Pedals, Pipes and Pizza" at Trinity Episcopal Church, playing Battle Hymn on the Aeolian Skinner. It's great fun to see where our young organists go in life!

Charles Brown teaches middle school and upper school vocal music at Maumee Valley Country Day School. Previous to this position he worked with Dennis Blubaugh at Musical Resources. He is the organist and handbell choir director at Zion United Methodist Church in south Toledo. Additionally, he sings with the University of Toledo Community Chorus and with the Palm Sunday Choir at Monroe Street United Methodist. He holds a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Wittenberg University and a Master's degree in Choral Conducting from Bowling Green State University.

Fr. Jeff Bunke is the priest at St. Timothy Episcopal Church in Perrysburg. Underlying his vocation to the priesthood is a deeply-felt commitment to music and its place in worship. His musical background includes being a singer, organist and keyboard musician. He joined our chapter two years ago and participates when his busy schedule allows. He is also a valuable connection to the fun and creative events at St. Tim's; we are glad to have him with us!

Denise Mathias is Director of Music and Organist at Monroe St. United Methodist Church, where her duties also include administrating the church's concert series and directing the church music initiative to the community (Young Voices of Greater Toledo). A long-time member of the AGO, she immediately transferred her membership to Toledo Chapter when arriving in Toledo in 2010! Handbells and children are two of the things she most enjoys about her job, besides playing the organ, of course!
