A message from our dean...

Do you remember when you first fell in love with the organ? I do. I grew up playing piano and wanting absolutely nothing to do with the organ. My mother played for church occasionally, and I loved many of the hymns we sang. But I didn't really ever hear "good" organ music, and I wanted absolutely nothing to do with playing pedals! It may not have helped that our church had what was probably a very old Conn Electric Organ (I think). I even remember tuning in once to "Pipe Dreams" with my oldest son in the back seat of the car when he was very young and he said, "The organ? That's the instrument of death!" He apparently only associated the instrument with funerals for some reason. So I went on, loving music, including Classical, Jazz, Pop/Rock, etc. but with no real introduction to what the organ was all about. I even sang in our small church choir after high school as I studied piano at the University of Toledo and our choir director gave me her copy of Flor Peeters' "Little Organ Book." I put it aside without any thought of ever using it. That was in 1985.

Fast forward to 2010 in my first fill-in church job, which I insisted would be on the piano, and after two weeks, the Pastor came to me and told me the congregation really wanted the organ. I agreed to give the Clavinova with its organ setting a try. After two weeks of that, I was ready to try a real organ, which just happened to be a 1964 Conn Electric. And I got out the Flor Peeters book. It didn't take me long, even on that organ, to fall in love!

We all start somewhere and the next two months will feature events that celebrate those beginnings of falling in love with our instrument, whether it's a small, old electric, a newer digital instrument or a full pipe organ. On Sunday, September 2, we will feature an exciting, rising young star Mitchell Miller at 4:00 p.m. in concert at St. Aloysius Catholic Church in Bowling Green. Mitchell received his bachelor's in organ at Oberlin and is currently studying in Germany at the Hochschule fur Musik und darstellende Kunst Stuutgart, pursing his Master of Music. Mitchell is a member of the AGO Young Organists Board and was the winner of the 2017 Cleveland AGO Quimby Competition for Young Organists. A potluck for AGO members will follow the recital.

Our annual Scholarship Auditions will take place at 3:00 p.m., Sunday, October 21 at Hope Lutheran Church Toledo, coordinated by our Education Chair Denise Mathias. If you have students or know any piano students who you think would be interested in learning about the organ, this is a great way to expose them to the instrument they may fall in love with. First time students are able to audition on the piano. Details are in this newsletter.

We have a second event for the month of October, a concert by Aaron David Miller on Sunday, October 7 at Monroe Street United Methodist Church as part of their annual concert series, organized by Denise Mathias. Aaron is a well known performer and composer with local roots. We have enjoyed him in recent years in live, silent film accompaniments at Community Church of Christ in Whitehouse. Aaron is a fantastic player and a prolific composer as well.

I challenge you to reach out to a young student or two and bring them to one or more of these events. Let them be inspired by Mitchell and Aaron and encourage them to pursue that inspiration with lessons, aided perhaps by scholarship money and a caring teacher. And if perhaps your love of the organ has lost some of its magic, you might be inspired too!

Mitchell Miller, winner of the 2017 Cleveland AGO Quimby Competition for Young Organists and graduate student at the Hochschule für Musik und darstellende Kunst Stuttgart in Germany, will be presenting an organ recital on Sunday, September 2, 4:00 p.m. at St. Aloysius Catholic Church in Bowling Green. The recital is sponsored by the Toledo Chapter of the American Guild of Organists and is free and open to the public.

Mitchell Miller Biography

A native of Cincinnati, OH, Mitchell Miller is currently a student at the Hochschule für Musik und darstellende Kunst Stuttgart, pursuing a Master of Music in the studio of Prof. Dr. Ludger Lohmann. Before coming to Germany, Mitchell graduated from Oberlin College and Conservatory with a Bachelor's of Music in Organ Performance and a Bachelor's of Arts in German. He studied organ with James David Christie, harpsichord and continuo with Webb Wiggins and Mark Edwards, and piano with Jonathan Moyer. Additionally, Mitchell studied clavichord with David Breitman in the spring of 2015, and with Oberlin's Distinguished Visiting Professor of Organ, Marie-Louise Langlais, in the fall of 2012. Most recently, Mitchell was awarded the prestigious William J. Fulbright Research Grant in order to study German Romantic-era organs and organ music as a student in Prof. Lohmann's studio. Previously he has garnered such honors as receiving first prize in the 2017 Tuesday Musical Scholarship Competition and the 2017 Cleveland Chapter Quimby Competition for Young Organists, being one of only five undergraduate organ majors from the US to be selected for the final round of the 2015 Taylor Organ Competition, and being selected as a finalist in the 2014 Arthur Poister Competition in Organ Performance. In addition to competitions, Mitchell is a frequent participant in master classes, having participated in classes with such esteemed teachers as Olivier Latry, John Grew, Harald Vogel, Nathan Laube, Michael Unger, and Renee Ann Louprette, among others. An active recitalist, Mitchell has performed at notable venues including Church of the Covenant (Cleveland, OH), Church of the Advent (Boston, MA), Calvary Episcopal Church (Cincinnati, OH), St. Mary's Cathedral Basilica of the Assumption (Covington, KY), First Congregational Church (Columbus, OH), The Brick Church (New York City, NY), and Musée des Augustins (Toulouse, France). In addition to repertoire, Mitchell greatly enjoys liturgical music and playing continuo. He was the Oberlin Sacred Music Intern at the Brick Church in New York City in 2016, participated in the 2015 Bach Aria Project in Boston, MA, as a continuo player, and was a student intern at the Church of the Covenant, Cleveland, OH, in 2013, where he worked with Jonathan Moyer.

On Sunday, September 23, 2018, St. Matthew's & St. Joseph's Episcopal Church will present an organ recital to benefit the restoration of it's Four Manual 1927 E.M. Skinner pipe organ, Opus 623-A. "Tea & Pipes" will include an informal reception at 1:30 p.m., with the concert at 3:00 p.m., featuring former Music Directors Dr. Timothy Huth and Dan Dillingham, with special guest Dr. Marie Mehler on trumpet. Timothy Huth hails from Fostoria, Ohio, where he grew up playing organ at St Wendelin's Church in grade and high school. After studying philosophy at St. Meinrad College Seminary, he received his Master's and Doctorate in Organ Performance at the University of Michigan. He is a former Dean of Ann Arbor American Guild of Organists, served as Minister of Music and Organist of St Matthew's and St Joseph's from 1997-2002 and is currently Organist at the First Congregational Church of Ann Arbor. Timothy has enjoyed playing recitals in France, Spain, Germany, Poland, Mexico, the US and Canada and maintains an active recital schedule. He is also a licensed massage therapist. Daniel Dillingham is Minister of Music at Central United Methodist Church of Detroit. He started his musical training at age 15 and at the age of 17 held his first organist position. Daniel holds degrees in Pipe Organ from Eastern Michigan University -Bachelor of Science and Masters of Arts. While at EMU he was awarded the Grace Sponberg Award for an outstanding scholar majoring in pipe organ. His organ teachers were Dr. Mary Ida Yost, Dr. Michele Johns and Dr. Marilyn Mason. A native of Michigan, he has held church positions in Dearborn, Royal Oak, Detroit and Grosse Pointe Woods. All awards are given at the discretion of the judges. Anyone who has received a large scholarship (\$350 and above) two years in a row will be limited to a \$100 award.

The \$500 Mary Anderson Award is given to the top High School qualifier

and can only be received once by an individual.

Scholarship monies are to be used for organ lessons from a member of the Toledo AGO and will be made payable to the student's instructor. Students who have previously been awarded a scholarship should have completed all previous year scholarship lessons before applying.

Applicant Requirements:

Each applicant will prepare two contrasting pieces (limited to 10 minutes total) and a hymn of their choice.

They will also be asked to sight-read a hymn.

Students auditioning for the first time may play their audition on the piano.

Up to one hour of practice time will be scheduled for each student. *Please call the church to arrange this time and speak* with Ms. Bailey (419-536-8383). She will schedule your rehearsal.

Each applicant must complete and submit the attached form and a letter of recommendation from their private instructor, pastor or church musician.
