

FROM THE DEAN



Dear friends,

Superstorm Sandy is raging outside, but I am still feeling the glow of Saturday's concert at Community of Christ Lutheran Church. Aaron David

Miller, who, although he now lives and works in Minneapolis, is still a Toledo favorite, played a wonderful program of "spooktacular" favorites on the 2-manual Reuter there. The A-minor Prelude and Fugue by Bach shared top billing with the popular classic "In the Hall of the Mountain King." A combined choral/handbell/organ and audience sing-along recast "Deck the Halls" in a minor mode with the text "Deck the Halls with Web and Spider."

After a brief intermission, we were treated to an old-fashioned movie experience. A short silent cartoon ("The New Car") was followed by the Charlie Chaplin classic "The Circus." In addition to his own improvised material, Dr. Miller's accompaniments included many keyboard standards: "Spinning Song" by Albert Elmenreich, Burgmuller's "Arabesque," the Scherzo from Vierne's 2nd organ symphony, and Gigout's Toccata in B-minor were just a few of the tunes I recognized as they flew past. His coordination of musical and cinematic events was remarkable: glissandi to illustrate Charlie Chaplin falling down; staccato grace notes for the pecking of a crow; even playing rhythms 'out of synch' when the new car was running out of gas and falling apart.

All in all, this was a great concert! There was a good turn-out of our membership, in addition to the local congregation. Children, families, old and young alike seemed to enjoy and appreciate the music and the fun.



Organ Recital by James Kibbie Sunday, November 11, 5:00 p.m. to celebrate the 20th anniversary of the church's Karl Wilhelm organ

This year marks the 20th anniversary of the Karl Wilhelm organ at St. Michael's in the Hills Episcopal Church in Ottawa Hills. To celebrate the occasion the church will offer a recital by James Kibbie, on Sunday, November 11 at 5:00 p.m.

Dr. Kibbie is Professor of Organ at the University of Michigan. He also maintains a full schedule of concert, recording, and festival engagements throughout North America and Europe, including appearances at the Cathedral of Notre Dame in Paris, London's Royal Festival Hall and Lincoln Center in New York. An internationally renowned authority on the organ music of Johann Sebastian Bach, Dr. Kibbie's recent recordings of the complete Bach works on historic baroque organs in Germany have been welcomed with enthusiastic critical and audience acclaim. Dr. Kibbie has chosen an exciting program including works by Buxtehude, J.S. Bach, Alain, Widor, and the 20th century Czech composer Jiri Ropek.
