This small (one manual, no pedals) organ was built ca. 1785 by Dutch builder Johannes Strumphler. Completely contained in a wooden cabinet, the air supply is generated by a foot pedal.



Christopher's award was in memory of Gene Trombla and represents a new scholarship for adults. Just a reminder—donations to the scholarship fund are gratefully accepted. You can also designate specifically for the Mary Anderson Award (top high school student) or Gene Trombla Award (top adult student).

Teachers, now is the time to start considering an entrant for next fall's auditions.
